

Ministries of Love Wedding Support Plan

A compassionate program framework for serving couples through ceremony care, donated items, volunteers, vendors, and community generosity.

Purpose of Wedding Support

The Wedding Support program of Ministries of Love is created to help couples feel loved, prepared, supported, and celebrated as they begin one of the most meaningful chapters of their lives. We believe that a wedding ceremony should not be defined only by budget, resources, or circumstance. A donated candle, a borrowed arch, a thoughtful ceremony script, a kind officiant, or a few words of encouragement can become part of a wedding day that reminds a couple they are seen, valued, and loved.

Wedding Support Mission

The mission of the Wedding Support program is to bless couples by helping them prepare for a meaningful, personal, and heartfelt wedding ceremony. Ministries of Love seeks to walk beside couples with compassion, offering resources that reduce stress, support their commitment, and help make their ceremony feel beautiful and intentional.

Wedding Support is rooted in the belief that love deserves to be honored. Every couple has a story, and every ceremony should reflect the heart of that story. Through donated items, volunteer support, officiant guidance, and community generosity, Ministries of Love helps turn compassion into celebration.

This program also allows members, ministers, donors, volunteers, and wedding professionals to take part in something deeply meaningful. When one person gives, another couple is blessed. When one wedding item is donated, another ceremony is made more beautiful. When one minister offers their time, a couple receives care at a moment they will remember forever.

Core Wedding Support Values

All Wedding Support efforts should reflect the values and heart of Ministries of Love.

- **Love:** Every couple should be treated with kindness, warmth, and sincere care.
- **Dignity:** Assistance should be offered in a way that honors the couple and protects their privacy.
- **Compassion:** Couples should feel supported, not judged, regardless of their circumstances.
- **Beauty:** Simple resources can still create a meaningful and beautiful ceremony experience.
- **Stewardship:** Donated items, funds, and services should be used responsibly and respectfully.

- **Community:** Wedding Support should bring together ministers, volunteers, donors, vendors, and families.
- **Commitment:** The focus should remain on the meaning of the marriage, not only the details of the wedding.

Primary Wedding Support Areas

1. Ceremony Support

Ceremony Support helps couples prepare for the actual wedding ceremony. This may include guidance on ceremony structure, vows, readings, ring exchanges, unity ceremonies, family involvement, remembrance moments, cultural or spiritual elements, and the overall flow of the ceremony.

These donations allow love from one celebration to move forward into another. What once stood beside one couple's vows may later frame another couple's beginning. It is a beautiful way to let generosity keep blooming.

4. Wedding Decor Lending Library

Ministries of Love may create a Wedding Decor Lending Library where approved couples can borrow donated or repurposed items for their wedding day. Items can be checked out, used for the ceremony or reception, and then returned so they can continue blessing others.

This lending library may include arches, signs, ceremony pieces, florals, lanterns, vases, table decor, aisle markers, and other reusable items.

A lending library allows donated items to serve many couples over time. It also helps reduce waste and creates a practical system for turning one-time wedding purchases into ongoing community blessings.

5. Couple Assistance Program

- Vendors should clearly define any donated or discounted services.

These guidelines help keep the program fair, respectful, and sustainable.

Donation Stewardship
